Description

The *Effects of Weapons of Mass Destruction/Terrorism Incidents on Mass Sheltering* course is an introduction to recognizing key on-scene indicators of incidents related to and/or requiring mass sheltering services as well as appropriate self-protective measures. The course also covers security issues unique to mass sheltering in a WMD/Terrorism incident, including appropriate notifications, activities, and useful tips. Through interactive, online training, learners will utilize analytical and problem-solving skills in order to provide the best response during a WMD/Terrorism incident. This course was developed by the American Red Cross in collaboration with Pearson Performance Solutions.

Primary Audience

The primary audience for this course is health care and public health personnel. In addition, personnel in non-governmental organizations, community-based organizations, and voluntary organizations can benefit from this course.

Completion of the *Foundational Awareness of Weapons of Mass Destruction/Terrorism* (AWR-190-W) course and the *Introduction to the National Incident Management System/National Response Plan* (AWR-191-W) course is required.
